Your love of teaching, and teaching with love, has surely changed so many lives.







The precious gift of friendship with Rachel will be treasured forever. May this beautiful and courageous woman of faith, who never stopped giving, rest in the peace of Christ.










Rachel Smith was such an inspiration to all of us at BGN. She was so kind, thoughtful and giving in every way.


Rest in peace Miss Smith.
