Dear Parent/Guardian

Thank you so much for your support with your son/daughter's return to school. I have been very impressed by how well our students have responded to the changes in our school day, whilst keeping our Gospel values at the heart of everything we do.

Our Behaviour Policy has remained largely unchanged, but we have had to make some adaptations in light of the current circumstances and one of these is related to the use of mobile phones. Our policy has always stated that: ***'students in Years 7 to 11 with mobile phones must not use them in school, unless requested to do so by a member of staff. These items must be kept switched off and out of sight in school bags'***.

If a student does not adhere to the rules, they will receive a warning and it will be logged on their behaviour record. The student's parent/guardian will also be informed and we will ask you to speak to your son/daughter about it. Should they ignore the initial warning, the phone will be confiscated by a senior member of staff and we will ask you, as the parent/guardian, to collect it from the school office at an arranged time. We realise that this is an inconvenience, but is necessary under our current Covid restrictions.
