About the In2STEM programme - Key Information

The In2STEM programme offers Year 12 or S5/S6 (or equivalent) students the opportunity to participate in our programme of activities taking place between Monday 22 July and Friday 23 August 2024.



Students will be provided with a bursary to cover travel and lunch costs. All events will be held within commuting distance of where students live or online.

For students living in areas where placements are not currently accessible, we are pleased to be offering In2STEM Online. This virtual programme includes online mentoring sessions and provides access to our workshops and competitions.

Interested students can apply by filling in the **Application Form** by **22 December 2023**. Students must meet our [eligibility criteria](#) in order to be shortlisted and a teacher reference is required to verify this. A reference request is sent to the teacher's email inbox automatically when their student applies.

Applications to our US 2023 Programme now open!

What is the US programme?

In partnership with The Fulbright Commission, the [Sutton Trust US Programme](#) is designed to support students from state schools across the UK to explore US University options.

It includes **two UK-based residentials** and **a week in the United States** staying on a university campus and visiting a variety of American universities. An optional second year of the programme **supports students to apply to US universities alongside their UCAS options.**

How can you apply?

To apply for the programme, you must:

Attend, and have always attended, **a state-funded**, non-fee-paying school/college.

Be in **Year 12** at the start of the programme.

We prioritise students based on a range of **social mobility criteria** including eligibility for free school meals, household income, and the context of their school and neighbourhood.

Applications will close January 15th 2024 and places are very competitive, so apply **ASAP**.

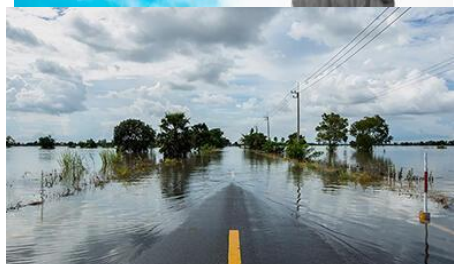

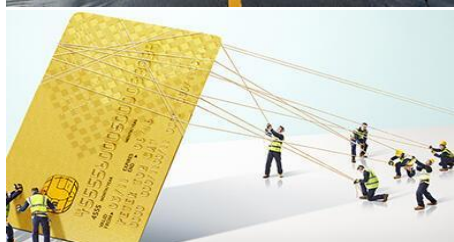
